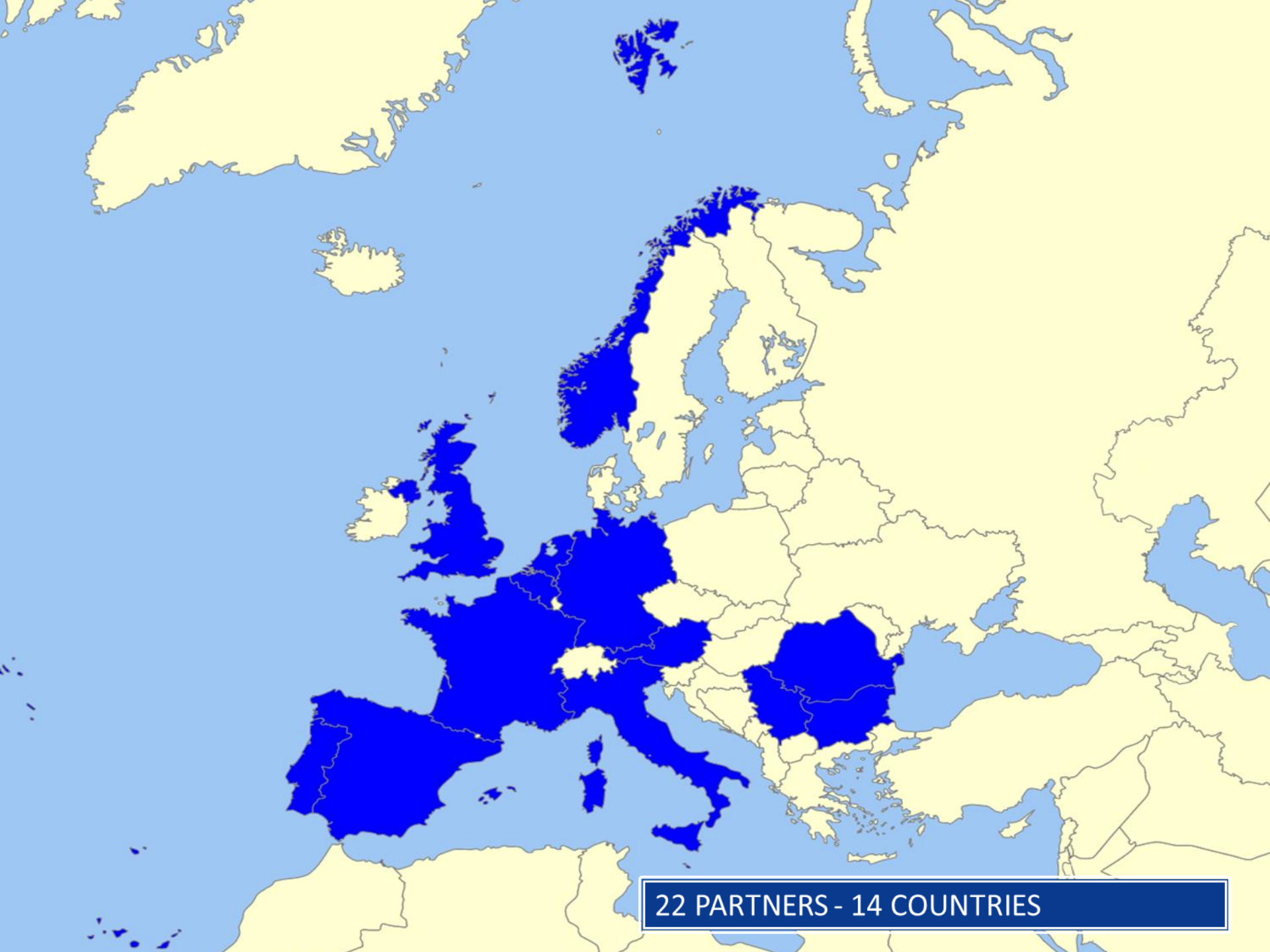

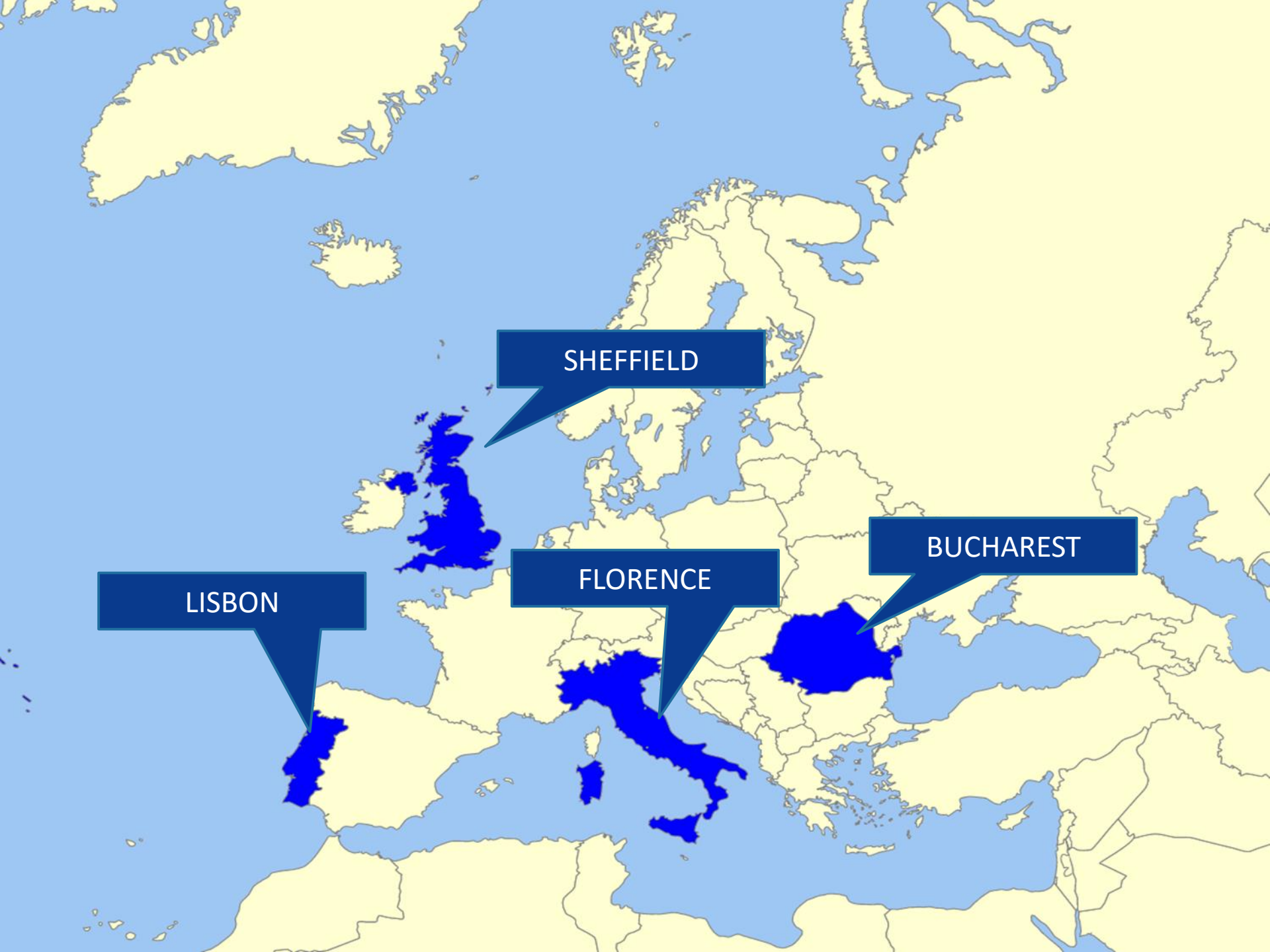
CITIZEN INTERACTION TECHNOLOGIES YIELD COMMUNITY POLICING OVERVIEW

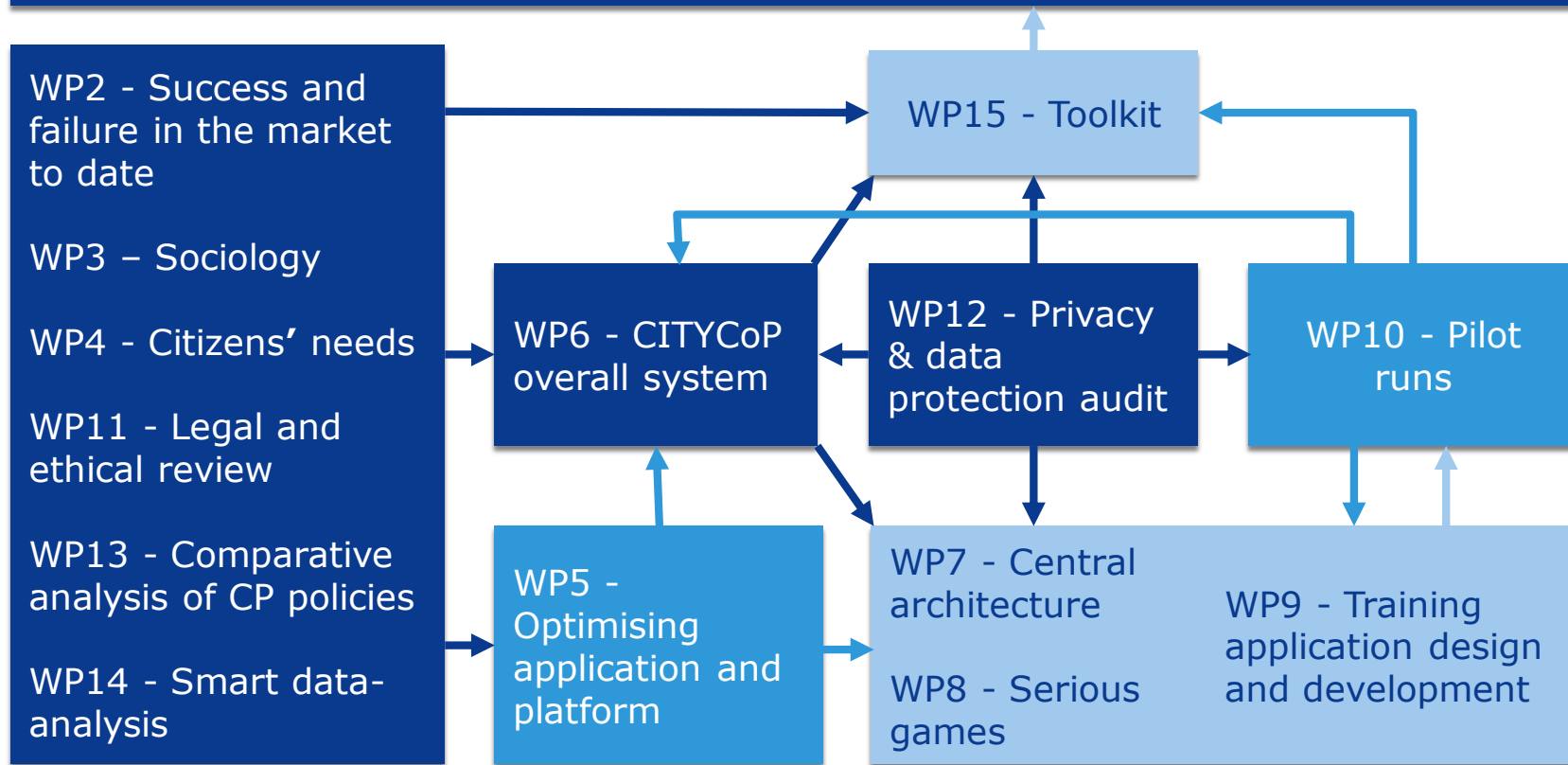

LEGAL, SOCIAL AND ETHICAL IMPLICATIONS OF USING SMART SURVEILLANCE IN COMBINATION WITH COMMUNITY POLICY STRATEGIES



Our review of the smart surveillance technologies showed four main disadvantages of smart surveillance - the threat to the right to privacy and social relationships; declining trust in the state that acts on categories and from a distance; discrimination; threats to security due to large scale storing of more data.

MAPPING OF ACTORS



The exercise of ‘mapping the actors’ becomes much more complicated when the layer of community policing is added to the typical smart surveillance landscape. The responsibility of the different parties is distributed by the applicable laws.

Thus, the data protection legislation defines the role of data controllers and data processors but also the role of the system developers and designers.
